MODERN PERSIAN POETRY

Sohrab Sepehri. Sohrab Sepehri was born in Kashan in 1928; His grandmother had published poetry and it is likely that Sohrab grew up in an ethos which upheld a literary culture. After a high school literature diploma, he entered Tehran University Faculty of Fine Arts in 1948. Five years later he gained his master's degree with distinction as the outstanding student. By then he had published his first three collections of poetry, By the Grass, 1949, The Death of Colour in 1951 and The Life of Dreams in 1953. A very talented artist and a gifted poet, Sepehri came to prominence with the publication of The Water's Footfall which was subsequently followed by The Traveller and The Green Space. Blending visual images taken from painting with eastern mysticism, Sepehri produced a kind of poetry which is unique and original. Sepehri died of blood cancer in Tehran in 1980.

Ismail Salami (alias Ali Salami). Writer, encyclopaedist, editor, translator and university instructor, Salami was born in Tehran in 1968. Salami has written and translated dozens of works ranging from literature to philosophy. Some of his publications include Madmen of History, (Tehran 1999); Persian Fairy Tales (Tehran 1999); A Study of Thirty Great Novels (Tehran 1999); Islamic Views on Human Rights (London 2001; New Delhi 2003); The Divan of Hafiz, (Tehran 2004); A History of Persian Literature, (Tehran 2002); An Encyclopaedia of Persian Literature (Tehran 2004); With All My Tears (Selected Poems of Fereydoon Moshiri, Tehran 2002). Another Birth (Selected Poems of Forough Farrokhzad, Tehran 2003); Maybe It's the Messiah (Selected poems of Simin Behbahani, Tehran 2004); Political System in Iran (Tehran 2004). Some of his articles have been translated into Italian, Chinese, Spanish, and Greek.

Abbas Zahedi. Writer, translator, educational researcher and university lecturer, was born in Gorgan in 1955. He is the author of a new system of writing for primary school children which marks his exceptional talent in educational issues. A distinguished researcher, Zahedi has succeeded in writing short stories with a limited number of letters for primary school children, thus enabling them to enjoy reading and to appreciate literature. His publications include Short stories For Primary School Children and Anthology of American Literature and The Traveller & We Nothing But Look (Poems of Sohrab Sepehri, Tehran 2002).

A CHRONOLOGY OF SOHRAB SEPEHRI

- 1928 Born in Kashan
- 1940 Finishes his preliminary studies at Khayyam primary school, Kashan
- 1943 Finishes his first year of high school
- 1946 Employed in Ministry of Education, Kashan
- 1948 Resigns from Ministry of Education; graduates from high school; begins his studies at the Faculty of Fine Arts, Tehran University; employed at Oil Ministry, Tehran
- 1949 Resigns after eight months' work
- 1951 The Death of Colours, his first book of poetry, published
- 1953 Graduates from the Faculty of Fine Arts with distinction; begins work as a designer at the Ministry of Medical Welfare; participates in several painting exhibitions, Tehran
- 1954 The Life of Dreams, his second book of poetry, published; begins working at the Ministry of Culture and Arts and teaching at Art School
- 1955 Translates Japanese haikus, most of which appear in the Literary Sokhan Magazine
- 1957 Travels to Paris and London; enrolls in the School of Fine Arts as a student of lithography
- 1958 Participates in Tehran's first biennial painting exhibition; travels to Paris and Rome; participates in Biennial exhibition, Venice; returns to Iran; begins work as the president of Audio-Video Organization, Ministry of Agriculture
- 1960 Participates in Tehran's second biennial exhibition; wins first prize in fine arts; in order to learn the art of carving on wood, he travels to Tokyo; visits different cities
- 1961 Visits Agra and Taj Mahal, India; holds his first individual exhibition in Abbassi Gallery, Tehran; begins teaching at the School of Decoration, Tehran; *The East of Sorrow* published; relinquishes official positions altogether.

- 1962 Holds individual exhibition in Farhang Gallery; holds another individual exhibition in Farhang Gallery
- 1963 Participates in a group exhibition in Gilgamesh Gallery, Tehran; holds an individual exhibition in Gulestan Film Studio, Darrus, Tehran; participates in Sao Paolo biennale exhibition, Brazil
- 1964 Travels to India, Pakistan, and Afghanistan
- 1965 Participates in a group exhibition in Borges Gallery, Tehran; The Water's Footfall published in the Literary Arash Magazine; travels to Europe
- 1966 The Traveller published in the Literary Arash Magazine
- 1967 Holds an individual exhibition in Seihun gallery, Tehran; *The Green Space* published by Rozan
- 1968 Participates in different exhibitions
- 1969 Participates in international painting festivals in France; earns special degree
- 1970 Travels to the U. S. A.
- 1971 Holds an individual exhibition in Lito Gallery, Tehran
- 1972 Holds an individual exhibition in Cyrus Gallery, France
- 1973 Travels to Paris
- 1974 Travels to Greece and Egypt
- 1977 The Eight Books published by Tahuri Publications
- 1979 Travels to England to receive medical treatment for blood cancer; returns to Iran
- 1980 Dies at Pars Hospital, Tehran; buried in the Holy Shrine of Sultan All, Mashad Ardahal, Kashan
